

### **NUMERACY**

### The Importance of Talk in Learning

Language is a powerful tool for your child's learning and development. Children learn best when they can talk about their experiences, ask questions, and explain their thinking. Talking helps them make sense of new ideas, build their understanding, and deepen what they already know.

That's why discussion and conversation are an important part of the school curriculum and are embedded within our Numeracy Agreement. Teachers encourage students to share their ideas, listen to others, and learn through talking.

### Maths Talk - Building Confidence in Numbers

Maths isn't just about getting the right answer—it's about understanding how and why we solve problems. **Maths Talk** is a way for children to work together, share ideas, and explain their thinking. By talking about maths, children build confidence, improve problem-solving skills, and develop a deeper understanding of numbers.

You don't need special materials or worksheets to encourage Maths Talk at home! Try simple activities like:

Odd One Out – Choose a set of numbers, shapes, or patterns and ask, Which one doesn't belong? Why?

Headline Stories – Give your child a short maths-related statement and ask, What could this be about?


Number Talks – Ask your child, How did you work that out? Can you explain it in another way?

Encouraging Maths Talk at home helps your child become more confident and capable in maths—while also making it more fun!

### **Bundaleer Forest Easter Bilby Egg Hunt**

In April 2024, a dedicated group of volunteers poured their hearts into reviving the beloved Bundaleer Forest Easter Bilby Egg Hunt. The event exceeded all expectations, and the organising committee was

truly amazed by its incredible success!



The hunt was held as a fundraiser for the Bundaleer Forest Community Areas Association and was supported by generous sponsorship and donations from 31 South Australian businesses, including many local businesses and others from all over the state.

Approximately 800 people attended, from all over the state, and over \$700 worth of Easter Eggs were collected over the 3-hour event. Our Bilby certainly was busy!

The day also featured a variety of fun activities, including a raffle, face painting, storytelling and the colouring in competition. With a variety of drinks, chocolate and hot cross buns, this adding to the day being extra special, allowing families to spend some down time, relaxing in the beautiful natural environment that is our forest.

Thanks to our wonderful community, we were able to raise \$4,237.00. This money went directly towards covering the insurance costs of the Bundaleer Forest Nature Playground and Picnic Grounds, allowing these facilities to remain open to the public to enjoy throughout 2024.
