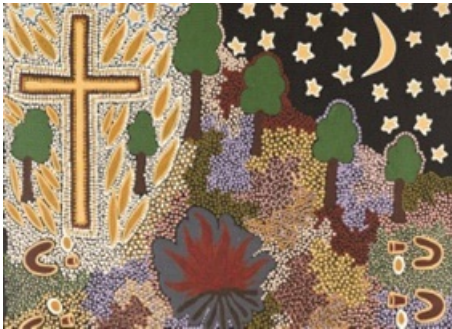


REMEMBRANCE DAY
